### **Move Forward, Together**

As most of you know, I will be transitioning to a new call in Great Falls, Montana at the end of March. God has called us to begin a new work of planting a church in that city, and that comes with both sorrow for leaving you all, and excitement for what God has in store for both of us. This time of transition is not just a waiting period, however. And so, I want to encourage all of you to take this time seriously as you prepare for what is next for this wonderful church family, and as you prepare for your next pastor.

The first thing I would encourage you to do is to only speak towards what you know. Speaking negatively about what is to come, or speaking about what the EPC will or will not do when you aren't certain, will only cause more confusion and gossip and will not be helpful in moving forward. Your elders will be the first ones to get information. If you have questions, ask them. If they don't know, chances are other people don't know either. Honesty and transparency will be crucial moving forward. If you don't know, that's ok. But I can assure you that I, your session, and your presbytery want to see First Presbyterian Church of Bucyrus grow and flourish.

Here are some common questions that I have been asked so far, that hopefully will clear up any questions you might have:

- 1. Will the presbytery assign a transitional pastor to our church?
  - No, the presbytery does not *assign* them. The presbytery has pastors (usually retired from ordinary ministry) who have been trained to be intentional transitional pastors for a church between pastors. They are focused on church health, outreach, and creating healthy systems and culture within the church as you prepare for the next pastor. The church will be able to interview and talk to the transitional pastors who are available and hire on the one they feel is the best fit.
- 2. Will it take a long time to find a pastor?
  - There is no clear answer on this. In the American church in general, roughly 35% of pastors will be retiring in the next 5 years, and many other pastors are leaving the ministry due to financial hardship or burnout. So, there is a pastor shortage in general, but any length of search is not due to our denomination. Also, with a transitional pastor in place, that search will not begin immediately. They will walk the church through how to be a place that will be healthy for a pastor and their family to come and feel supported and cared for.
- 3. Could a woman be ordained to be our pastor?
  - Yes. In the EPC, women's ordination is considered a non-essential, and it is therefore left up to the local congregation to decide if they want to ordain women or not. That has been the case from the founding of the denomination.

On top of these things, there must be unity in love. Each of you who are members of this church have made vows to serve the Body of Christ to the best of your ability, to promote the peace and purity of the church, and to join yourselves together. As Elder Tom Britton said on Sunday, "This was never Pastor Jeremy's church. It was here 200 years before he got here, and by God's grace it will be here 200 more years." This is Christ's church, and you are his flock, his people, his bride, and his emissaries. You have a mission and a purpose, and no one gets to opt out. Fight together and for each other, not with each other. We already have an enemy who is prowling like a lion seeking someone to destroy. There's nothing he delights in more than seeing a church at each other's throats: he doesn't have to do anything if we are already doing his job for him. Love and serve each other in radical ways. Step out of your comfort zones and say with the Prophet Isaiah, "Here am I, Lord. Send me."

Support your elders: the burden of this transitional phase will rest heavily on them. Pray for them, speak kind words of encouragement, and volunteer when they ask the congregation to step up. As we have said numerous times before, the ministry belongs to the *saints*. And YOU are the saints. Step up and step in to what God has for you and this church.

Lastly, I want to remind you all of how much I love you, and how dear this place is to me. I will be your biggest cheerleader. And I can't wait to check in and see the amazing work God is doing through this beautiful body of believers. As I have prayed for you all for these past six years, so will I continue to pray.



### **Snickers Brownies**

1-1/2 cups white sugar ¾ cup (12 T.) butter, melted ¾ cup all-purpose flour 3 eggs ½ cup unsweetened cocoa powder 1 teaspoon vanilla extract ½ teaspoon salt 1 cup Snickers, chopped ¼ teaspoon baking powder

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9" square baking pan. Mix sugar, flour, cocoa powder, salt and baking powder in a large mixing bowl. Mix butter, eggs and vanilla extract together in a separate bowl; add butter-mixture to the large bowl with flour mixture and stir batter until well blended. Pour the batter into the prepared baking pan. Bake in the preheated oven until edges are brown and center is set, about 25 minutes. Remove brownies from the oven and sprinkle the chopped candy bar pieces on top, lightly pressing them in while the brownies are still hot. Let the brownies cool completely before cutting, about 30 minutes.
